# **Common Inquiry**

Q) I would like to open a bank account. What should I do?





A) You need your Residence Card, Passport, My Number Card (if you have one), your telephone number which a bank can contact you on and your personal seal. Some banks will accept your signature if you don't have it.

Some banks will require the applicant to be able to communicate with them in Japanese, while others will allow you to have someone who speaks Japanese for you.

Depending on the bank, some may require you to have been living in Japan for more than 6 months, while others will allow you to open an account shortly after your arrival in Japan.

There are many banks where you can open a bank account online on their English language website.

Note: To open a new bank account, your residence card must be valid for three months or more. Check with the bank you wish to open an account as the conditions vary from bank to bank. Please do not forget to cancel your account when you leave Japan.
